



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

Peter Mack, Guest Artist and Conference Clinician



Irish pianist **Peter Mack** is celebrated for his moving performances and his easy rapport with audiences. He has performed throughout the United States and Europe, as well as in Australia, India, and the former Soviet Union. He is the winner of the New Orleans, Young Keyboard Artists, and Pacific International Piano Competitions. His prize in the Sherman-Clay competition included a Steinway

grand piano. Naturally, he is a Steinway artist! Peter Mack is well known for his extensive repertoire, having performed twenty-five concertos with orchestras. A choral scholar at Trinity College Dublin and a fellow of Trinity College London, he has a doctorate in piano performance from the University of Washington. Dr. Mack is equally in demand as a performer, clinician, convention artist, adjudicator, and teacher. Students of Peter Mack are frequent winners of local, national, and international competitions. In 2011, Peter Mack joined the select group of teachers who have had more than one national winner of the Music Teachers National Association piano performance competitions in the same year, when students of his won both the junior solo and senior duet national finals. Peter Mack is Professor of Piano Performance at Cornish College of the Arts in Seattle.



Marvin Blickenstaff Conference Clinician



Marvin Blickenstaff is known among piano teachers throughout the country and around the world for his teaching. lecturing, performing, and publishing. He is a frequent presenter at regional and state conventions of music teachers and at the national conference of the Music Teachers National Association, For sixteen summers he was on the faculty of the International Workshops where he performed and lectured in Canada, Austria, Scotland, Norway, France, and Switzerland. In 1995, and again in 2004.

The Institute of Registered Piano Teachers of New Zealand sponsored him in concert and workshop tours of that country. The Marvin Blickenstaff Endowment Fund was established in his honor in 2001 by MTNA, and in 2007, the on-line journal Piano Pedagogy Forum published tributes to Blickenstaff honoring his contribution to piano teaching in America. Also in 2007, he was named Fellow of the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto. He was honored with MTNA's highest honor, the MTNA Achievement Award, in 2009.

Blickenstaff holds degrees from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music and Indiana University where he received both academic and performance honors. He has served as chair of the piano departments at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Goshen College (IN), and from 2000 to 2013 he was President of the Frances Clark Center for Keyboard Pedagogy. He is on the faculty of the New School for Music Study where he teaches private lessons. He has directed the Program for Excellence in Piano Study (PEPS) for advanced students since 1999 and is on the Executive Planning Committee of the National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy.



Jerod Impichchaachaaha' Tate Commissioned Composer



Jerod Impichchaachaaha' Tate was born in 1968 in Norman, Oklahoma. He is a citizen of the Chickasaw Nation and is dedicated to the development of American Indian classical composition. He is praised and honored for "his ability to effectively infuse classical music with American Indian nationalism" (Washington Post).

His commissioned works have been performed by the National Symphony Orchestra, Detroit Symphony Orchestra, Minnesota Orchestra, Colorado

Ballet, the Santa Fe Chamber Music Festival, South Dakota Symphony, Philadelphia Classical Symphony, and Santa Fe Desert Chorale, among others. He is also a three-time commission recipient from the American Composers Forum. In 2011, he received an Emmy Award for his work on the Oklahoma Educational Television Authority documentary, *The Science of Composing*.

Tate earned his bachelor's degree in piano performance at Northwestern University and his master's degree in piano performance and composition at the Cleveland Institute of Music. He was appointed Creativity Ambassador for the State of Oklahoma in 2008.

Works available are *Iholba'* (*The Vision*) for Solo Flute, Orchestra and Chorus and *Tracing Mississippi*, Concerto for Flute and Orchestra, recorded by the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra and Chorus, on Thunderbird Records.

Since 2005, Tate has been Composition Instructor for the Chickasaw Summer Arts Academy. In 2004 and 2005, he was Composer-in-Residence for the Grand Canyon Music Festival's Native American Composer Apprentice Project. In 2007, he was Composer-in-Residence for The Joyce Foundation/American Composers Forum, teaching composition to American Indian high school students in Minneapolis.

He is currently composing a new ballet score commissioned by Oklahoma City Ballet.

Commissioned Work

Tuklo means "Two" in the Chickasaw language and is a set of duets for Northern Plains Flute and B^b Clarinet. The duets are dedicated to R. Carlos Nakai (Navajo/Ute flutist) and are loosely based upon the quintet he commissioned from Jerod Tate, entitled À Bec Quintet. The duets are meant to be a companion to this work. *Tuklo* contains melodies from Nakai's tribal heritage and seeks to create new classical literature for the Northern Plains Flute. In the spirit of Bartók's 44 violin duets, Tate intends to continually add duets to this set. The composer wishes to express his deepest gratitude to MTNA for providing the catalyst for this new work and to the student performers, Kristen Swartley and Dillan Francis, daring enough to take on this unique project.

Commissioned Work Performers

Northern Plains Flute: Kristen Swartley studies flute with Parthena Owens at Oklahoma City University, and teaches flute with El Sistema Oklahoma. After completing her undergraduate degree at Eastern Mennonite University, she spent a year directing an orchestra program in Bolivia.

B^b **Clarinet: Dillan Francis** is currently a first year graduate student at Oklahoma City University studying clarinet performance with Brad Behn, principal clarinetist for the Oklahoma City Philharmonic. He also performs and teaches woodwinds throughout the greater Oklahoma City area.



Thomas Lanners Distinguished Teacher



Dr. Thomas Lanners has performed throughout the U.S. and abroad, presenting his New York solo debut in Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall in 2004. His performances have been broadcast nationally and internationally on programs such as American Public Media's Performance Today and RTÉ Radio 1's Sunday Miscellany in Ireland. His recordings, Touches of Bernstein: The Complete Published Piano Music of Leonard Bernstein, Ned Rorem: The Three Piano Sonatas, and Ned Rorem: Piano

Works, Volume 2 have received stellar reviews. He has collaborated as a chamber musician and recitalist with many of the world's top performers, including Walfrid Kujala, Barry Snyder, Nancy Ambrose King, Leone Buyse, and Swedish clarinetist Håkan Rosengren.

As a dedicated pedagogue, in 2012-13 Thomas gave master classes on the NYU-Steinhardt School's *Piano Artist Master Class Series* and at the Universities of Miami, Texas-Austin, and Zacatecas, Mexico. He also served as a Distinguished Guest Artist at the Lee University International Piano Festival and Competition in Tennessee. Thomas served a one-week teaching residency at the Eastman School in 2008, and has presented sessions at multiple MTNA conferences. He is an active writer on musical topics, with several feature articles published in *American Music Teacher* magazine, as well as having articles published in *Clavier* magazine and the piano pedagogy newsletter *Soundpoint*. Lanners received his Master's and Doctoral degrees from the Eastman School in New York. His major teachers include Barry Snyder, John Perry, and Jerome Lowenthal. He currently serves as Professor of Piano at Oklahoma State University, having begun teaching at OSU in 1995.

Spark Talk! Davis Dorrough National Certification 101



Drawing on his first-hand knowledge gained from recently receiving national certification, the presenter will provide an overview of MTNA professional standards while sharing valuable tips and resources needed to navigate the certification process.

Davis Dorrough recently acquired MTNA Professional Certification in the fall of 2013. He holds a master's degree in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from the University of

Oklahoma (OU) and a Bachelor of Arts in Music with an emphasis in piano from Arkansas Tech University. His performance and pedagogy teachers have included Jane Magrath, Barbara Fast, and Timothy Smith.

While at OU, he received a graduate assistantship in group and applied piano teaching as well as the Dorothy Detrick Kendall Memorial Scholarship and the Martha M. Boucher Piano Scholarship. Davis was recently named the 2014 recipient of the MTNA MarySue Harris Studio Teacher Fellowship, awarded to one newly established independent music instructor in the U.S. In 2010, Davis was chosen as the winner of the Arkansas Federation of Music Clubs Collegiate Competition and has performed in recitals and master classes locally and abroad, including the 37th Annual Classical Music Festival at Schloss Esterhazy in Eisenstadt, Austria.



Spark Talk! Heejin Jang Preparing Intermediate Students...



Debussy's works frequently are technically and musically beyond the grasp of intermediate students. In this workshop, accessible but satisfying impressionistic and contemporary alternatives by educational composers and early works of Debussy and Ravel will be presented.

Heejin Jang, a native of South Korea, is currently a DMA candidate in Piano Performance and Pedagogy at the University of Oklahoma, studying with Jeongwon Ham, Jane Magrath, and Barbara Fast. Jang received a Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from

the Ewha Women's University and a Master of Music in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from the University of Oklahoma. She was featured as the winner of the several competitions, including University of Oklahoma Concerto Competition, 2008-2009; MTNA Oklahoma State Division Young Artist Competition, 2009 and 2010; and Oklahoma Community Orchestra Young Artist competition, 2011. Additionally, she was named the alternate winner of MTNA South Central Division Young Artist Competition, 2009 and 2010, and received a second prize in the Donna Turner Smith Piano Competition, 2012.

As a graduate teaching assistant, Jang has taught collegiate group and applied piano and recently received The Provost's Certificate of Distinction for Outstanding Graduate Assistant Teaching, which was given to the top 10 percent of all graduate assistants across campus by student evaluations for courses taught during the Fall 2013 semester.

In Spring 2014, Jang gave four doctoral workshops as a part of her degree at the University of Oklahoma. Titles included: *Preparing* Intermediate Students for Chopin, Preparing Intermediate Students for Debussy and Beyond, Tension Relief and Injury Prevention Strategies for Musicians and Effective Practicing – Strategies for Specific Age Groups and Teachers.

Mind Over Music

Breathing: A Method to Manage Performance Anxiety

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

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

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
