

East Central University

East Central University (ECU) will be celebrating the 250th anniversary of the birth of Ludwig van Beethoven with two concerts during the year 2020. The concert coordinator is currently conducting a search for a student-pianist to present a polished performance of Beethoven's, Sonata Op. 27, No. 2, (Sonata guasi una Fantasia), aka "Moonlight" Sonata, at the first of these concerts, to be held on Sunday, February 23, 2020 in the 1,100 seat Ataloa Theatre on the campus of ECU. A performance honorarium of \$500 will be awarded to the performer upon successful completion of the concert engagement.

The selection of the performer will be made by December 15, 2019, and will be completed after careful review of the following materials to be provided by any student-pianist who wishes to be considered for this performing opportunity:

- A video or in person performance of the sonata
- One or two letters of recommendation from individuals capable of commenting on the applicant's technical and artistic abilities and their ability to successfully present the sonata at the concert.

Beethoven at 250!

The deadline for submission of all materials is November 15, 2019. Depending upon the response, the organizers may choose to audition the top three candidates. These auditions would be held in the first part of December 2019.

Norman Area Music Teachers Association NAMTA Hosts Fall Festival at OU - Oct. 26

Mark your calendar for the NAMTA Fall Festival which will be held the last Saturday of October (26th) at the OU Catlett Music Center. Any students of OMTA members (collegiate included) may be entered in a variety of divisions, including Memorized Solo or 2-Piece, Ensemble or Non-Memory Solo and 2-piece categories.

There is also a New Beginner division for young students who may not have studied 6 months or may not be playing pieces on the staff. All participants receive a written critique and stickers. Students in the memory divisions will receive a ribbon. High School participants playing all 4 years in a memory or ensemble divisions qualify for a \$50 Sr. Award. Students may dress in costume and younger students and siblings are encouraged to visit the Kidsfest activities with fall crafts, musical games and face painting.

How do young children learn?

Part 1: Prenatal to toddlerhood

Prenatal-eighteen months is now being labeled the "critical period" for music learning and eighteen months-three years, the "crucial period." So, how do those little ones process the music? An infant's ears are already working from four months in utero. In fact, the ear is the first sensory organ to fully develop. Movements and sounds link up neural connections which eventually lead to steady beat and sense of pitch.

In toddlerhood, take advantage of that movement/sound relationship by rocking and bouncing, while listening and singing. You are building a musical brain!

Changes to Auditions and Competitions

Improvements to the 2020 District Achievement Audition Entry Form

- · Verification of teacher's membership status
 - · Use the membership directory to verify the date that dues were paid.
- · Payment of State Achievement Audition entry fees online only
 - Entry fees for District and State will be paid using the District entry form.
 - · State entry fees will only be refunded for a student who does not qualify for the State Achievement Audition.
 - Students receiving a I+, I, or I- qualify for the State Achievement Audition.
 - Students receiving a II, III, or IV do not qualify for the State Achievement Audition.
 - If a student does not qualify for the State Achievement Audition, it is the responsibility of the teacher to notify the State Achievement Audition Coordinator, Jennifer Jennings, at omtaachievementauditions@gmail.com within ten (10) days of the District Achievement Audition. Required information: student(s) name, District Achievement Audition center, and rating. Rating will be verified before refund.
- Selection of State Achievement Audition time preferences
 - · 2020 State Achievement Audition Catlett Music Center on the campus of the University of Oklahoma in Norman.
 - The following is a list of time preferences available for students/families to select 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choices. These

- District Achievement Audition centers will not offer a State Achievement Audition registration table and will not
 accept State Achievement Audition entry fees.

IDENTIFYING A STUDENT AT COMPETITION:

At a competition, if a teacher identifies his or her student to a judge, the student will be disqualified and play for critique
only. The student will be notified by the competition chair of the reason for the disqualification.

NEW LATE FEE COMING 2020:

 As of June 30, 2020 teachers who have paid MTNA/OMTA dues after June 30 are required to pay a one-time late fee of \$50 to OMTA before entering students in competitions and auditions.
